Dear Parents,

The Early Years team would like to thank you for attending the Target setting evening. This month we have lots of exciting things to look forward to like Sports day. We would also like to wish everyone *Ramadan Kareem*.

Topic:

This month, we have planned learning activities in the Seven (7) areas of learning; we are starting our topic of 'Space'. As well as focusing on additional phonics and math's lessons.

Within this topic, we will be learning about; space, aliens, sentence structure, writing for different purposes and looking at a range of books.

Mathematics:

This month we will be covering a wide range of aspects including: Counting and comparing, shapes, addition, subtraction. We will still be looking at number formation and place value.

Literacy:

In March, we will be continuing our current topic of 'Space', the books which we intend to use are: On the Moon by Anna Milbourne and Benji Davies, Beegu by Alexis Deacon, Laura's Star by Klaus Baumgart. If you are able to get any of these story books, please read them at home with your children and engage them in retelling and sequencing the events in the stories as well as remember facts. We will be continuing guided reading this month. In addition we will be looking at blending CVC (consonant vowel consonant), CVCC and CCVC words. As well as: writing simple sentences and writing for different purposes.

Phonics:

Phonics is a way of quickly teaching children to read skillfully. Children's achievements in reading and writing start with an ability to speak and listen. We will be following the songs of sounds phonics program stage 1. This term in phonics, we have started streaming, this allows us tailor our phonics lessons to suit the children's needs.

Ms. Jade's group have been revising the sounds: s, a, t, p, l, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, e, u, r, h, b, f, l, j, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, ay, ee, igh, ow, oo, ar, or, er, ou, oy, ear, air while focusing on blending, CCVC words.

Ms. Inge's group have been revising the sounds: s, a, t, p, l, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, e, u, r, h, b, f, l, j, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th. Their focus has been on recognizing the letters/sounds and their tricky words: l, the, he, she, we, be and me.

Ms. Afshan's group have been revising the sounds: s, a, t, p, l, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, e, u, r, h, b, f, l, j, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, ay, ee, igh, oo, ow. Their focus has been on recognizing the letters/sounds as well as creating CVC words.

Ms. Diana's group have been revising the sounds: s, a, t, p, l, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, e, u, r, h, b, f, l, j, v, w, x, y, z, qu, ch, sh, th, ng, ay, ee, igh, ow, ar, or, ur, oi, oy, ear, air. Their focus has been on reading and writing simple sentences which include CCVC and CVCC words.
